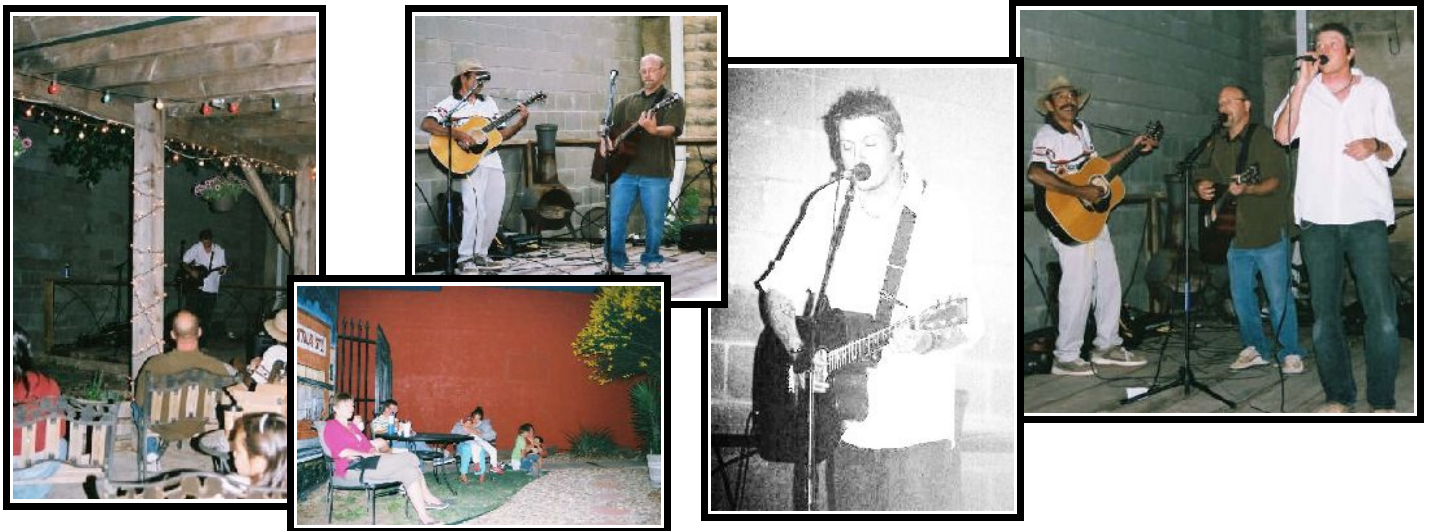

the label site. It's not acoustic by any means. If you like honky-tonk and heavier county-rock style music, you'll love it.

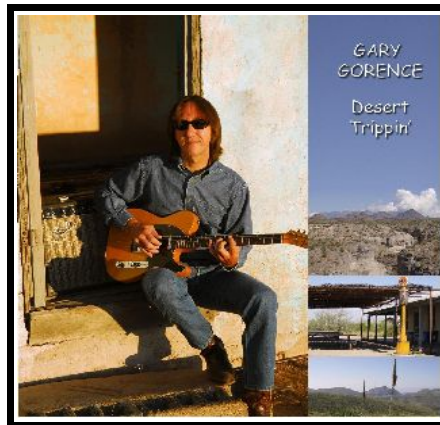
